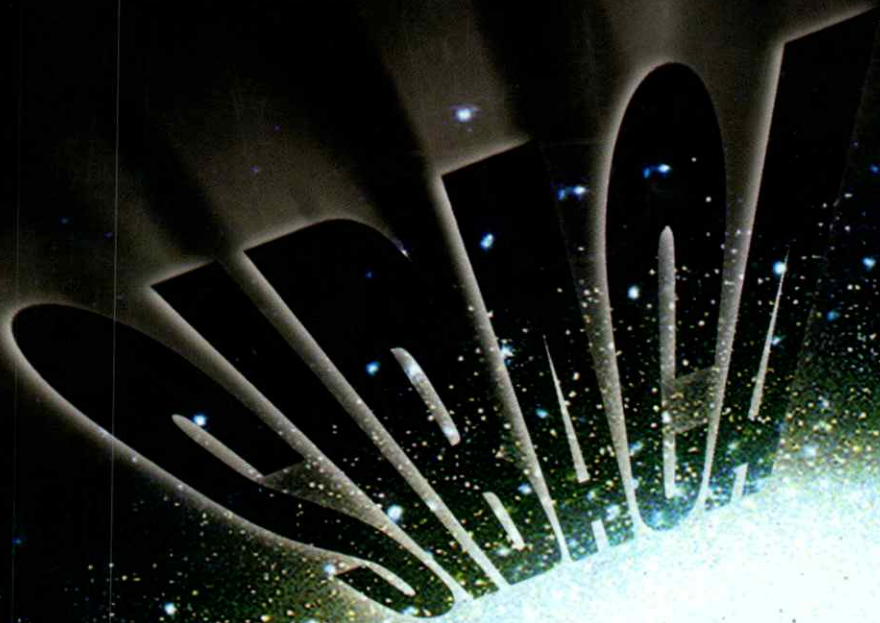

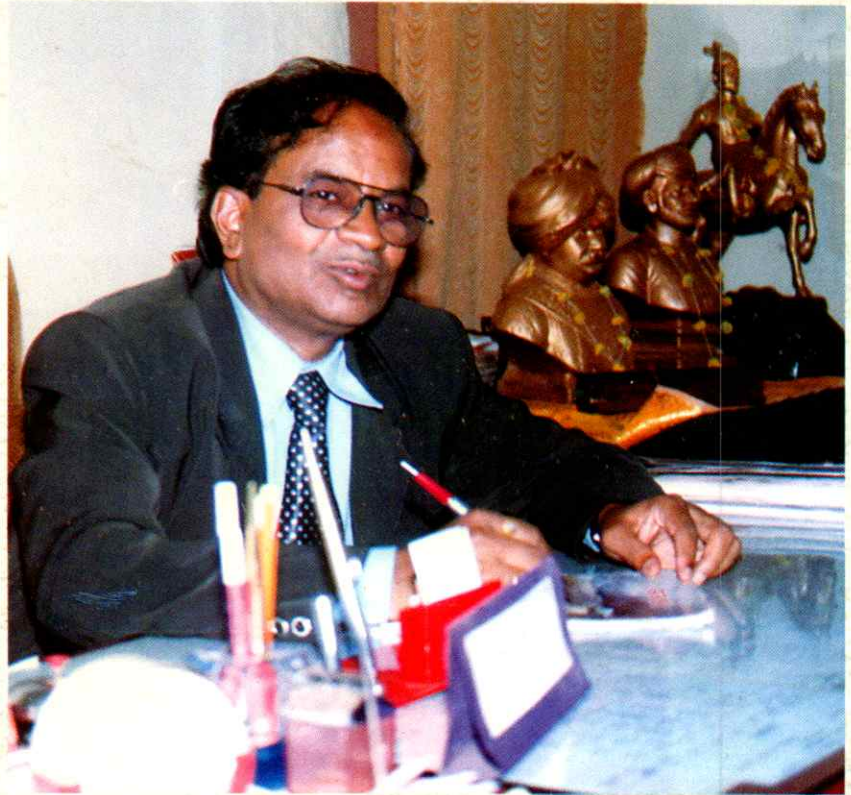

➤ HISTORY OF THE INSTITUTE ➤

'Shivraj' named after the greatest ever king of Maharashtra, Chh. Shivaji Maharaj, was established in 1964 by late M. P. Shri. V. T. Patil, the founder president of Tararani Vidyapeeth, Kolhapur in the hilly, remote area of southmost part of the Kolhapur district. In 1974 Shivraj college was handed over to Karmveer Vitthal Ramaji Shinde Shikshan Sanstha Gadhinglaj. Under the dynamic leadership of Hon. Shri. Balasaheb Mane, the college attained perfection. The faculty of science was started in the year 1982 and has remained a pioneer science college for the students from Ajara, Chandgad and Gadhinglaj.

Ours is a very rich library comprising 50,000 books. Basically our students belong to least academic background and do not have ideal environment for academic growth. Even though this is the fact; our college has produced a number of brightening stars.

Under the leadership of Prof. K. V. Kurade, the present President, the institute has started various professional courses, like B.B.A., B.C.A., B.C.S., B.Sc. (Computer) at UG level and M.Sc. (Computer), M.A. (Hindi, English, Marathi, Economics), M.Com (Accountancy) and M.B.A. at P.G. Level. The professional wing SIBACA has also started Adult and Continuous Courses like Nursing, Balwadi Training, Journalism, library Management etc.

The thirst of the institution is to sharpen our students to aspire for M.P.S.C. and U.P.S.C. We have produced Various class one officers.

OUR ASSETS :

The college has a vast campus of 14 acres. It is the pollution Free zone in Gadhinglaj. Our infrastructure consists of lecture halls, well equipped laboratories, a well all modern Computer lab with all modern electronic facilities. Ours is a unique library. We have two separate gyms for ladies and gents. We have 400 meters track, a football and cricket ground. Our staff consists 22 Ph.D. holders and 16 M. Phils.

✦ PERSONALITY ✦

If man is a bundle of habits, a gentleman is a bundle of manners. A manner or good manners is an ornament. Good manners are indispensable to all. They are a better profession than wealth beauty and talent.

A man who does not possess good manners, cannot become a well-bred-man. It is very clearly expressed, the difference between a well-bred and a ill-bred man. In that one immediately attracts one's liking, the other one aversion or dislikes. Good manners contribute charm to persons. Ability means observation, concentration reason and judgement. Reliability means loyalty, honesty, sincerity, enthusiasm, faith, optimism and ambition; and will power means courage, decision, initiative, regularity, punctuality, orderliness, energy, carefullness, self discipline and self control on themselves. It is not only possible but also easy for anyone to develop his will-power or personality. The will-power has been compared to the power of engine of a motor. It is there all the time strong, capable and powerful, However, it needs, like the engine, some, outside forward motion to it. Activate it and make it go. Similarly,

on the other hand, for the growth of will-power, power of imagination is required. Imagination fires us with enthusiasm. It creates and undergoes the interest and it motivates each and every of our actions. If the will is weak or hesitant, it should be reinforced by imagination. Imagination has always been the pilot of our mental powers. By activating and enriching our imagination we can develop our personality and make it attractive as well as forceful. The force of will-power will grow by constant practice. It has truly been said that "where there is a will, there is a way."

Confidence, determination, understanding, sympathy, irritability, easily annoyed, haste, all these and many other personality traits of an individual can be detected from the tone of his voice and the manner of his expressions. Thus, the tone of voice can be regarded as a kind of mirror of one's personality. Similarly the words, phrases and expressions we use will give the mental penetration to our personality.

➤ BPO Initiated Jobs : What's the next Professional step ➤

By now, everybody is familiar with the working lifestyle of Business Process Outsourcing or BPO employees. Increasing stress levels being ignored in return for the vivacity of better lifestyle and easy money. But, has the thought of professional education crossed their minds. The issue is whether this ignoring of stress levels is really worth all the efforts and what follows after the stint at the BPO Industry ?

According to a recent study, apart from an erratic schedule - sleeping when the world is awake and working away when world retires to bed that kills not only their family lives, but also their personal life. The regular BPO employee who is mostly a graduate or undergraduate goes through a harrowing time if he wishes to switch careers. Hopping from BPO to BPO being the only alternative.

Most of these graduates do not acquire a professional in the notion that having a BPO job brings completeness. Though there are BPOs offering opportunities for further education these options have very few takers, reasons ranging from lack of desire to dipped confidence levels, disturbed sleep patterns, lack of concentration, increased stress levels and lack of funds that are mostly blown away on leading a trendy lifestyle.

The Solution for these issues is simple but it needs immediate implementation so as to derive better results - professionally as well as personally.

Regarding the increasing stress levels among

BPO employees, more and more therapeutic sessions should be added to the schedule. A daily twenty-minute Yoga and meditation would help in increasing concentration levels, understanding oneself better and understanding emotions. These meditative exercise would also prevent the BPO employees from getting into unwanted and tangled relationships. None of the BPOs have these psychotherapy sessions at present.

Also, there should be a team of expert counselors / psychologists available twenty-four hours. They may act as mentor and act as good purgatory agents if an employee wants to vent his / her feelings in cases of disturbed social life. This may be one of the greatest ways of directing our BPO youth towards a safe future.

According to recent reports, the BPO market for Information Technology in India is all set to grow from the current \$ 1.3 billion to over \$8 billion by 2010.

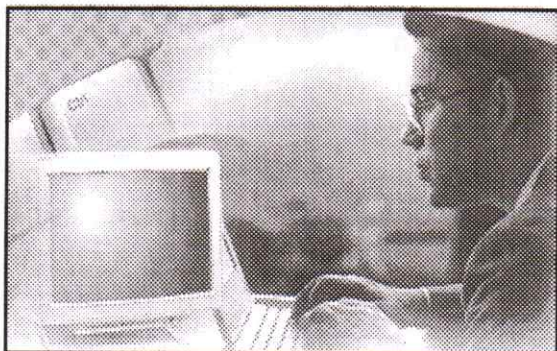

The highlights of this report were various aspects of the BPO India, with special focus on

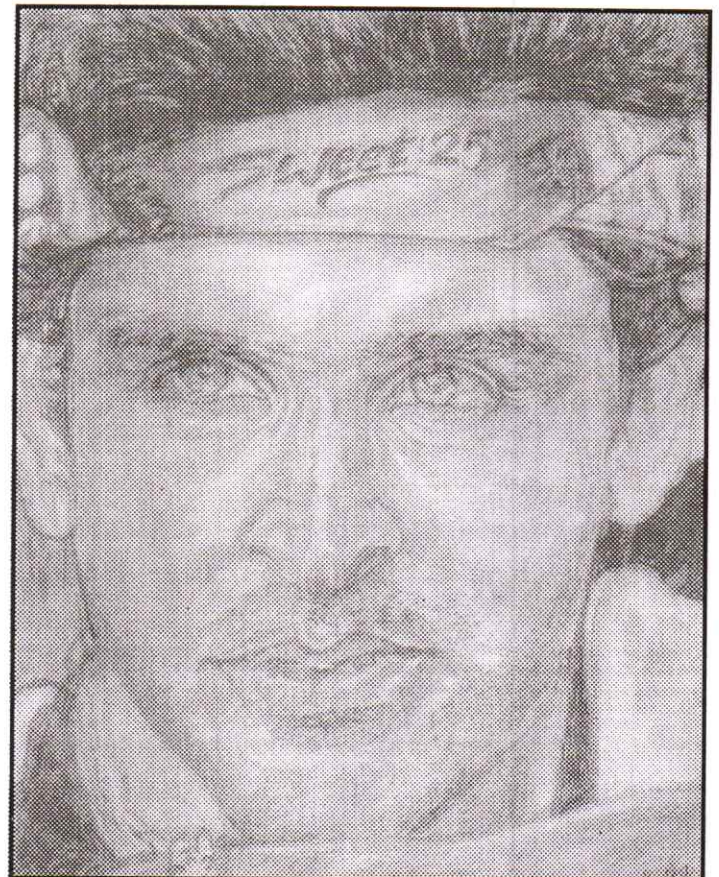

Statement issued by Guruji, the coach of a team that made a surprisingly early exit from World Cricket 2007.

I would like to offer no excuses for our performance. However, it would be totally inaccurate to assume that we lost because we did not play well. Well, we did not play well, but that's not the reason we lost. The seeds for our defeat were sown in the field of technology.

A team cannot be expected to do well when its channels of communication are blocked. Thanks to severe network connection, we were not able to exchange ideas as often as we should have. There are those who believe that we could have simply met and talked face to face, but this is the age of technology. Is there a need to meet a person if you can call him up on his cell? Sadly, this did not happen and we paid the price. I recommend that team members should carry Bluetooth cell phones on future tours so that we can communicate even in the absence of the telecom network.

On the subject of communications, I would also like to express my extreme dissatisfaction with the security of our networks. E-mail and SMSs were frequently intercepted and published in the media. How do you expect players to play well if they do not know whether an offensive message they have sent has reached the right person(s)?

The wall is no good if our firewalls are defective. Substandard systems were also behind several of the injuries and problems afflicting the team. Thanks to the poor quality of the gamepads, one of our key bowlers found that he could only bat and not bowl in World Cricket 2007. This affected his performance, especially his bowling which has gone into a downward spiral. Several players also suffered from finger injuries as the

notebooks allotted to the team had sub-standard track pads. We were sometimes accused of making crude gestures with our hands. We were only trying to exercise fingers that had been almost dislocated by third rate track pads! The absence of proper computer furniture and accessories also led to poor posture while gaming, resulting in spinal injuries and muscle strains.

We have been accused of lacking devices. But we were only good at our hardware. How can a team function if its players are worried about how they are going to squeeze in extra songs into their ipods or if they have enough space on their mobiles to download the latest MMS scandal? The game is not just played in the mind; it is also played on system. And all we had were outdated consoles and Pc's with dated graphic cards. We could not win games on a playstation. How on earth could we be expected to win on the field?

Our defeat is not just a defeat for the nation, but for its technology sector. I would like to take this opportunity to ask entrepreneurs to come forward and ensure that the teams of the future are well-equipped technologically when they go for such tournaments. We may lack technique and ability, but we should never be found wanting on the technology front. We need to rebuild, not the team, but the H/W that lies behind it. To play a good game you need a good system and our sport is no exception to its rule.

I would like to conclude by announcing my resignation from the post of coach. My decision has nothing to do with the performance of the team. Victory and defeat are a part of game and one should take them in one's stride. But no self-respecting coach can rate the rejection of a request for an Apple-Power Book (with 2 GB RAM and a 360 GB HDD) It is one of the things to work with an assembled team, but quite another to work with an assembled notebook.

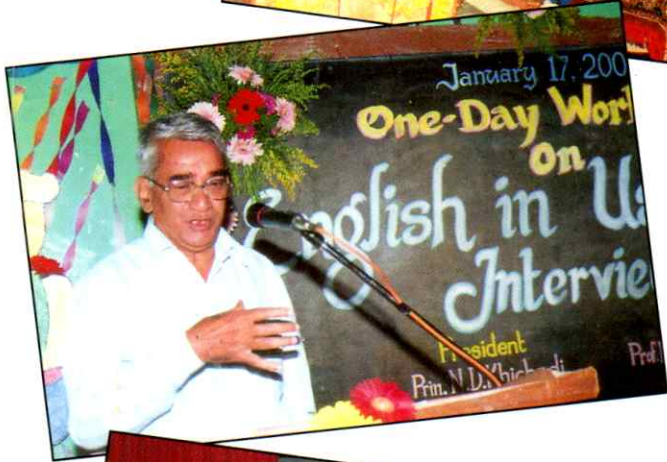

So today there is availabiliy of surplus jobs only the requirement is of a secured job.

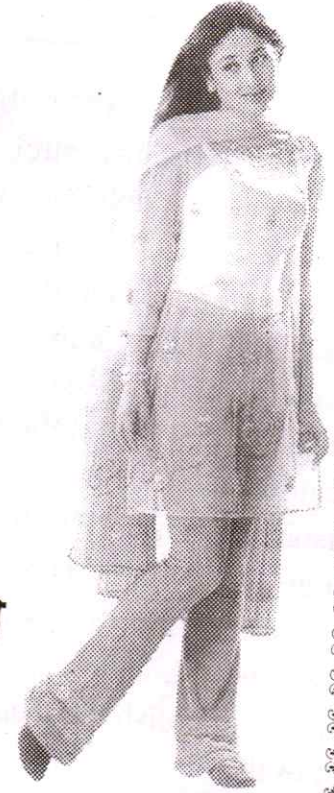

- b) A circular path where you would be rested and refreshed completely every time you came to the starting point, ready to move on or pass on the button.

Now if you think (b) is the better answer then why does the modern industrial world continue sticking to (a) for all its activities ?

The ecology and industrialised economies are at longer heads. This is because, unlike nature, our industries, are linear. As Paul Hawken has pointed out, our business takes resources, transforms them into products plus waste, and sell the products to consumers who discard more waste when they have consumed the products. Profits made by consuming more and more is the only priority. The troublesome waste we produce that poisons our air, lands and rivers the ecological substratum from where we originally got all our concern. Sustainable patterns of production and consumption need to be cyclical, imitating the cyclical processes in nature. To achieve such cyclical patterns, we need to fundamentally redesign our business our economy and our life style. We need to imitate nature's soft, cyclical ways.

In industrial Ecology, Thomas Graedd and Braden Allenby provide the following definition of industrial Ecology, the way all production systems need to head : "The concept requires that an industrial system be viewed not in isolation from its surrounding systems, but in concern to optimise the total materials cycle from virgin material, to finished material to component, to product, to obsolete product and to ultimate disposal. Factors to be optimised include resources, energy, and capital."

✦ E-WASTE : A GLOBAL PROBLEM ✦

At least two billion PC's have already been sold globally and there has also been a sudden increase in the sales of electronic items ranging from refrigerators, air conditioners, cell phones, VCD & DVD Players, TV's, personal stereos etc. As a result the quantum of electronic waste is increasing daily. Estimates reveal that in the year 2008 one computer will be for every new one put on the market in the USA. European studies estimate that the volume of E-waste is increasing 6 to 8 percent per year which is almost three-times faster than the growth of the municipal solid waste.

It is not only the quantity of the E-waste that is alarming, but the toxic ingredients contained in them, which cause serious threat to occupational and environmental health. E-waste is a complex mixture of toxic substances, such as lead and cadmium in computer batteries and polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB'S) in older capacitors and transformers. In addition to these, brominated flame retardant is used on printed circuit boards, plastic casing, cables and cable insulations, which releases highly toxic dioxins and furans when burned to retrieve copper from wires. When E-waste is used in landfills, toxic elements reach out to contaminate the groundwater and when such waste is burned it emits toxic fumes.

There are other serious environmental fallout of E-waste. The recycling of computers has serious occupational and environmental implications. The main applications of lead in computers are glass panes and gasket in monitors and solder in printed circuit boards. Lead causes damage to the central and peripheral nervous systems, blood, kidney and reproductive system even at low levels. It affects the endocrine

system and its serious negative effects on the brain development of children are well documented. With increasing lead exposure, the production of hemoglobin and red toxic with a possible risk of irreversible effects on human health since cadmium is eliminated only very slowly from the kidneys, cadmium accumulates in them, and once the critical concentration has been reached, kidney damage will develop chronic obstructive lung disease has been observed in workers exposed to high concentrations of cadmium.

It is estimated that 25 percent of the early world consumption of mercury is used in electrical and electronic equipments. Mercury can cause damage to various organs including the brain and kidneys. Chromium is used as corrosion protection of untreated and galvanized steel plates and as a decorative or hardener for steel housings. It easily passes through cell membranes and gives rise to toxic effects. Chromium can also cause damage to DNA.

Polyvinyl Chloride (PVC) is largely used in electronics. Dioxin, a known carcinogen can be formed when PC is burned within a certain temperature range. Men regularly exposed to PVC may be more likely to develop testicular cancer. The culprit could be estrogenic - chemicals called phthalates, which are used to soften PVC. Barium is used in computers in the front panel of cathode ray tubes to protect users from radiation. Its short term exposure may cause swelling of brain tissue, muscle weakness and damage to heart, liver and spleen. Beryllium used in computers has recently been held responsible for respiratory distress and also implicated in lung cancer. The list of toxic chemicals in E-waste appears almost endless. So we have to think on that early.



ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE

Researches are falling over themselves to re-enact the creation, and people are already accepting robots as friends, companions and lovers. In Japan household robots number in millions. Most Robots today are things like vacuum cleaners and rest are doing some cute, some interesting and some boring things like carrying on micro conversations ("What is your name?")

The mindset towards robots has changed in surprisingly short span of time. A couple of decades ago, they were seen as curious toys or miracles or dangerous entities that could threaten our domination on the planet - in short much advertisement was being made about them. Today tell someone "Fitzy" won the annual table tennis championship.

We are amazed at the intelligent things these toys can do. What will they be able to do a decade from now ? Thirty years ! Will it be like in Bicentennial man, where there are almost part of society, with the same status we accord to ourselves ? Will they be classified as species ? Will they have noisy sex ? Just how intelligent can they really get ? etc. Of course we don't know any of the answers, but it won't hurt to take a romp through the questions.

'Pong', the sympathetic Robot, was developed several years ago at IBM's Almaden Research Faculty. It is a moving head that "sits on table and once it makes eye contact it smiles or frowns based on its interpretation on your mood."

"I found it fascinating and creepy at the same

time. There is something deeply unnerving about a machine looking at you. If the researchers, replaced glass eyes, I'm sure it would send shivers down your spine. The idea that machine can approach humans may be deeply repugnant. Perhaps we do think machines that can look in the eyes."

That John Dvork's 2001 account of experience with a robot was just intelligent. Dvork is no new-comer to intelligent creation. He is renowned technology author and columnist.

"Eye R-2 Muse" designed by The Korea Institute of Industrial Technology has been called the world's first entertainer robot. She does, dance, moves and since people don't like seeing hideous steel structures doing those things, 'Eve R-2' muse has a realistic body, artificial skin, hair and pair. You know what's it yes, Artificial eyes of which we think a better job might have been done but who are we to complain still, those eyes are horrifying and one says that "that glazed, nightmarish gleam speaks for itself." We conclude that you probably wouldn't feel uncomfortable with this one looking you in the eye, but what if "she" had "realistic glass eyes ?"

Now take a look at the movies at - <http://sripurl.com/aigrob1-WT-S> (Waseda Talker no.s) doesn't quite look human, but from the videos, you will get, even through it advanced in terms of speech production. Where have all the nice robots gone ?

Then professor Istiguro, who emphasises human like appearance in his robots head to <http://sripurl.com/aigrob3>. The page says Replied Q1

is interested with people "with impersonating a T. V. interviewer" who were talking to mean that it was presented as life like. The 1st video clears things up and all of them are worth watching. If only those body movements would have been more fluid ! And then you realize you are already comparing the bot to a person, professor is concerned.

For good listing of human old robots is Visil. They can do rather more than show off by climbing stairs, and that was just a couple of years ago, which is even more in fact about the distant future. It this where we have been screaming.

"They are coming ! They are coming."

Japan is showing us the way when it comes to accept robots in our daily lives. In that country they are not viewed as potential mostrosists rather they are gentle-being creatures. In Japanies religion every creature including robots have lifeforce. These are accounts of how robotic pets reduce stress and make life nicer for old folks whose children don't visit them often in one old age home. Two robotic seals function as pets for the residents, who are delighted to strike them and feel them flapping their filppers, "old fogies", you might say.

Hans Moraves, old time researcher at Cornegle Mellon University says, "The effect of roots clearel has implications for the economy, social security will have to be expanded introduced at lower and lower ages till essentialities, everyone lives on social security."

The taxes will be paid by fully automated business run by robots. And human beings will have to deal with the problem of excess leisure.

Ron Arkin roboticist at the robotics and A-1 Group at LAAS / CNRS in France says, "I would

expect people to form psychological attachments with these artifacts. We already do so more or less to cars, video games to AIBOS... would you want your daughter to marry a robot ? What would the Church think of such unions ?"

Honestly we haven't the foggiest but lets talk photoshops at possibilities. What gets some people brows all silly quetions like "What if they become more intelligent than us ?" And will they take over ? and so on.

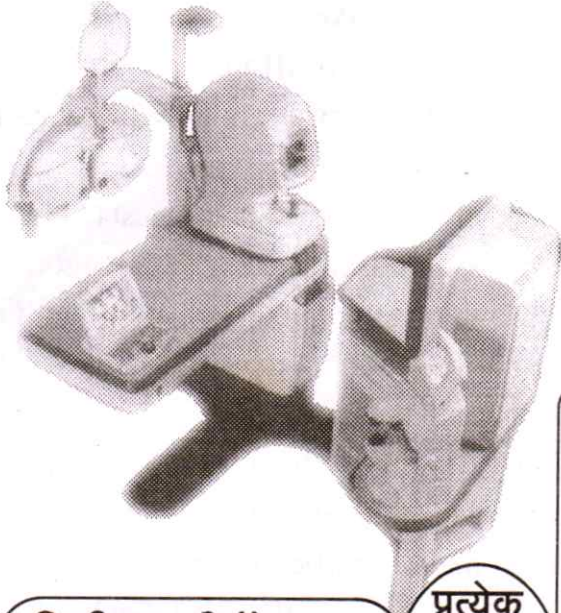
Turn us out to 2001, Stephen Hawking recommended that humans change their DNA through genetic modification to stop inelligent machines "talking over the world" what can we say ?
