Shivraj College of Arts, Commerce and D.S.Kadam Science College, Gadhinglaj was established by Late.Hon.Shri.V.T.Patil (M.P.) the president of Tararani Vidyapith, Kolhapur on 26th June 1964. Later on it was handed over to the present Sanstha, Karmveer Vitthal Ramaji Shinde Shikshan Sanstha Gadhinglaj, Dist.-Kolhapur under the leadership of Late Hon.Shri.Balasaheb Mane (M.P.) on 23rd April 1973. At present the Sanstha is working under the able guidance of Hon.Prof.K.V.Kurade. The motto of our institution is "Service to community itself is a Supreme religion". It implies the purpose and objectives of education.

The college was started with Arts and Commerce faculties at initial stage. Later on in 1982 the faculty of science was introduced as the demand of the southern part of Kolhapur district. To cope-up with National and global needs, self financing courses like B.B.A., B.C.A., B.C.S. and B.Sc.Computer were started from 1999. Additionally we are running at present various career oriented courses.

The college is situated in the hilly, region on Maharashtra-Karnataka border area. The college has got 33,300sq.m of eco-friendly premise of its own where the academic, administrative buildings, the huge playground, multipurpose hall, Ladies hostel and Gymkhana are situated.

The college has permanent affiliation of Shivaji University, Kolhapur and is included in the list of 2(f) and 12 (b) under UGC.

 - To introduce new concepts in cashless economy Credit cards/Debit Cards, Payment Apps in banking & Net banking and Overall Digital Banking.
- 3. Context:-

After the announcement of demonetization policy by Central Government, confusion and chaos was created throughout the nation. Especially in rural area, Cash for exchange was not available in banks and ATM counters. This has created emergency like situation in trade, commerce & health as well as daily routine of common people. Under such crisis & circumstances to create awareness regarding cashless economy was the only & foremost option. In this light a special campaign was planned at state and university level through NSS. Our NSS unit tried its best to make the campaign the best practice of our local area.

4. Practice:-

State level planning of the activity was planned under the guidance and directions of chancellor of university/ Governor of Maharashtra. Workshops were arranged at University & District level. Our 15 NSS

volunteers participated in these workshops. These 15 NSS volunteers oriented 250 volunteers of our college NSS units.

In the second round these oriented NSS volunteers were divided in 10 groups for further implementation. They created awareness regarding various concepts in cashless economy, like
