



Shivraj College of Arts, Commerce and D.S.Kadam Science College, Gadhinglaj was established by Late Hon.Shri.V.T.Patil (M.P.) the president of Tararani Vidyapith, Kolhapur on 26th June 1964. Later on it was handed over to the present Sanstha, Karmveer Vitthal Ramaji Shinde Shikshan Sanstha Gadhinglaj, Dist.-Kolhapur under the leadership of Late Hon.Shri.Balasaheb Mane (M.P.) on 23rd April 1973. At present the Sanstha is working under the able guidance of Hon.Prof.K.V.Kurade. The motto of our institution is "Service to community itself is a Supreme religion". It implies the purpose and objectives of education.

The college was started with Arts and Commerce faculties at initial stage. Later on in 1982 the faculty of Science was introduced as the demand of the southern part of Kolhapur district. To cope-up with National and global needs, self financing courses like B.B.A., B.C.A., B.C.S. and B.Sc.Computer were started from 1999. Additionally, we are run at present various career oriented courses.

The college is situated in the hilly, region on Maharashtra-Karnataka border area. The college has 33,300sq.m of eco-friendly premise of its own, where the academic, administrative buildings, the huge playground, multipurpose hall, Ladies hostel and Gymkhana are situated.

The college has permanent affiliation of Shivaji University, Kolhapur and is included in the list of 2(f) and 12 (b) under UGC.

Our college has been accredited on 16th February 2004 by NAAC in its first cycle with 'B' Grade and Re-accredited on 3rd March 2015 in its Second cycle with 'B' Grade.

Election Commission of India launched special drive to enrol left out elector with a special focus on first time electors.

The students admitted to our institute are from hilly, rural area. Most of them are of 18 years old. From these no student to be left behind in registration process, our college has taken special initiative for creating awareness registration as electors.

Our institute has been organizing the campaign for last several years. This year it has become the best practice of the institute.

4. Practice:-

As a part of this campaign

- 1. Institute established voter registration cell and appointed Dr. A. G. Hardare as a Co-ordinator for the same.
- 2. Eligible first time electors were identified through the admission process.
- 3. We classified the student into two categories: I) Students completed 18 years II) students going to complete 18 year up to 1st January.
- 4. These students were informed about required documents for registration by arranging a special campaign.
- 5. As part of awareness campaign following activities were organised
 - a) Street play.
 - b) Poster presentations, wallpaper.
 - c) Digital board.
 - d) Lectures.
 - e) Ralies.
- 6. Forms were made available in the Voter Registration Cell.
- 7. Duly completed registration forms were collected, scrutinized and submitted to Divisional Electoral Registration Cell, Gadhinglaj.
- 8. Voter Id's were distributed to the students.

5. Evidence of Success:-

- a. 194 eligible students registered through this campaign.
- b. The effect of this, remaining students registered at their villages.
- c. These fresh electors actively participated in Local Self Government Electoral process.

We could register only those enrolled students.
